2015 - A key year for climate justice advocacy In June 2015, the LWF council adopted the "Public statement - Advocacy and Action for Climate Justice" with specific advocacy tasks for political leaders and member churches and the historic decision to "not invest in fossil

fuels" anymore.

In December 2015, the LWF delegation was present at the historic COP21 in Paris and delivered

meaningful and effective message. The advocacy work was completed by regular climate advocacy trainings, climate project support, and network building for young people.

The "steering team" was formed by seven youth leaders from the seven LWF regions and one creative advisor. They developed the objectives, program plan, and motto of the network:


